### **1. History at Random**

David Cogger has taken a year's absence while he moved house to Knutsford, but is now hoping to put on another "History at Random" course in 2015-16 similar to the one which seemed to go down well in 2013-14.

It would consist of a series of illustrated talks on unrelated historical subjects, including the Great Plague of 1665, the beginning of railways, anniversaries in 2015-6, the towns and routes of North Wales, the Chester to Manchester road and several other topics.

### **2. Day Trip to RAF Museum, Cosford 19<sup>th</sup> May 2015 - £7**

Over 70 aircraft of international importance are housed in three wartime hangers within the National Cold War exhibition, which opened in 2007 at a cost of £12.5 million.

See the world's oldest Spitfire and a Lincoln Bomber, just two of the highlights in the Warplanes Collection. In Test Flight, there is the TSR2 and Bristol Type 188 constructed of stainless steel.

The Transport Collection in Hanger 1 includes the Comet 1A and Gnat T1, previously used by the Red Arrows. The engine and missile collections total over 60 and are arguably one of the finest collections in the world.

This is the only place in the UK where you can see Britain's three V bombers: Vulcan, Victor and Valiant.

Please note, some exhibits are outdoors, Refreshments are available or bring your own.



For the past four years, the Environmental Action Group has worked with a number of other environmental organisations within Sandbach to transform Brook Wood into 12 acres of meadow and woodland that is a pleasure to visit. There are good quality trails in the wood which you can access from the roundabout where the Wheelock by-pass joins Old Mill Road, or from Townfields, where there is ample parking.

Brook Wood is a major recreational asset to the town, which was, until work started in 2010, inaccessible, overgrown and used as a dump for rubbish. Sandbach is privileged to have such woodland with such easy reach of the town centre. The Environmental Action Group is justifiably proud of what they have achieved.

A 26 acre open-air living museum, costumed staff bring the museum alive with stories of a special time and place in history, and give you a truly authentic experience that will stay with you forever.

Step back in time at the canal side village, where you can indulge in traditional tastes of the past in the baker's, sweet shop and at the 1930s fish and chip shop.

Pay a visit to the chemist and learn about the strange ingredients used to treat all manner of complaints and ailments or Quench your thirst in the Bottle and Glass Inn.

Descend on foot into the underground drift mine and learn how coal was mined in the Black Country in the mid-nineteenth century.
